What Is the National Gathering on Christian Initiation™?

The National Gathering on Christian Initiation™ is an annual two-day conference for parish Christian initiation ministers and diocesan catechetical, liturgical, and evangelization leaders. Steeped in the vision of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the National Gathering on Christian Initiation™ seeks to promote the vision of the Church as constantly evangelizing, catechizing, and initiating disciples. Throughout the conference, participants will explore the theoretical and practical aspects of initiation ministry, learn from interactive multimedia presentations, engage in prayerful reflection on the liturgies of the RCIA, and share their knowledge and experience with initiation ministers from around the country.



At this year's NGCI, the Holy Spirit will be working through the participants and team members to breathe new life into our ministry. While the pandemic has stretched us in the way we approach this work, we are also tired from working so hard to adapt to the current situation. It will be exciting to work together as we turn the struggles of our ministry into opportunities for full parish renewal.

The National Gathering on Christian Initiation™ will have two tracks. Parish Leaders and Initiation Ministers will deepen and enrich their work as they gain practical skills, discuss common challenges, and share best practices. Within the Parish Leaders and Initiation Ministers track, one may choose English or Spanish language breakout sessions. Pre-conference distance-learning sessions will be available for new ministers and those interested in exploring the basics of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Regional or Diocesan Trainers will explore and discuss practical strategies for implementing effective training and formation in their local communities!

Theme: Evaluating and Revitalizing the RCIA in Your Parish

The theme for the 2022 National Gathering on Christian Initiation™ is Evaluating and Revitalizing the RCIA in your Parish. A thorough assessment of our parish's catechumenal ministry is beneficial for the life and vibrancy of the faith community. The NGCI team members will use the RCIA ritual text and the 2020 Directory for Catechesis to guide participants through an honest evaluation process. While we will celebrate the good work that is being done in the parish community, we will also ask the hard questions and raise the bar as we strive to fully implement the Church's vision. Finally, participants will have the opportunity to develop a strategic plan that includes a more fruitful collaboration with clergy and full inclusion of the baptized faithful in the initiation process.





Goals of the 2022 Gathering

- Offer participants new insights for evaluating their initiation ministry efforts.
- Equip participants to revitalize initiation ministry in their community.
- Prepare participants to share a renewed vision and strategic plan with leaders in their parish.

Rose earned both her BA in psychology and ancient Greek and MA in pastoral ministry from Loyola Marymount University. Her ministerial passions are liturgy and initiation sacraments.

Monique Jacobs is the director of faith formation in the Diocese of Reno and accompanies seekers as a spiritual director. She has worked in a professional ministry setting for over forty years, serving as a religious sister and in leadership at local and

diocesan levels. Monique completed her graduate degree in religious education from Fordham University, NYC. She contributes regularly to the Faith Forum series in the Reno Gazette Journal, has partnered with the Five Loaves for video catechesis and Our Sunday Visitor for family formation curriculum, and currently hosts a weekly Finding God video series, spotlighting the Spirit in daily life. Her joy in ministry is to serve as a mentor and companion to others to highlight their gifts and help build up the body of Christ.

How can Christian initiation ministry (or the vision of the Rite) revitalize a parish?

Victor Klimoski is an organizational development consultant and facilitates writing retreats and workshops. He served as director of lifelong learning for Saint John's School of Theology for fifteen years and was academic dean for seventeen years at the

University of St. Thomas's School of Divinity. He holds a PHD in adult learning and development from the University of Minnesota as well as an MA in theology from Saint John's, Collegeville. He has written extensively on theological teaching and learning, based on his consultation with nearly fifty seminaries across the country, and has published six books of poetry, with a seventh released in January 2022.

Why is it important for a parish to enter a process of evaluation and planning?

"At its core, evaluation is about learning from our efforts to achieve important outcomes. Done well, evaluation enables us to identify what works best, what engages people in the process, and what next steps are available. That sort of data makes planning specific, focused, and keyed to real needs and possibilities."

Why should people come to NGCI?

"Work on this level of significance demands a great deal of those who commit to it. Gathering to share experience and wisdom is a profound way of being renewed for the journey ahead and ensuring that important insights do not get lost—or taken for granted! Each person coming contributes to what we know about the process, the various ways of sustaining it under differing circumstances, and intensifying its role as central to the renewal of the Church for mission in the world."



Michael Ruzicki is the training and events manager at Liturgy Training Publications and the director of sacred music and liturgy for St. Mary of the Lake and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Chicago. Previously, he served as a parish pastoral associate and diocesan

coordinator of adult and sacramental formation in the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Michael is a former team member of the North American Forum on the Catechumenate. He is the author of *Guide for Training Initiation Ministers: An Introduction to the RCIA* (LTP, 2018). Michael studied at the Catholic University of America and the Washington Theological Union.

How can parish leaders use the vision of the RCIA to make a profound impact on a community?

"Many of us have heard, in these or similar words, that 'the baptismal catechumenate should inspire all faith formation efforts in the parish.' Yes! But, can we honestly say that we have taken this seriously? Now is the time we let this model shape all of parish life."

Why should people come to NGCI?

"For this year's Gathering, I am envisioning an Upper Room Pentecost moment. Together, a group of disciples will come together—mindful that a mission was placed before them, unsure of the path they must travel, but certain that there will be big challenges ahead of them. There, we will have tough conversations, support each other in our ministry, and pastorally and professionally challenge each other to see things in a different way. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we will be shaken—shaken and set on fire to go forth and make disciples of all nations."

Wendy Barton Silhavy is the senior coordinator for liturgy and music in the Office for Divine Worship, Archdiocese of Chicago. She received her BM in Church music from Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa, and her MA in liturgical music from St.

John's University, Collegeville. She brings twenty-five years of experience in parish, seminary, and diocesan liturgy to her work with the archdiocese. Her interests in liturgy include the relationship between liturgy and catechesis and the impact of liturgy on our everyday lives.

Why is it important to evaluate your initiation ministry?

"It's a natural temptation to rely on old information as the years go by. Taking time to evaluate allows us to reset our expectations and way of doing things. . . . If we stand still in our ministry, the world will change around us and we will not have the same impact, even with approaches that have been successful in the past."

Why are you excited about NGCI? What are you looking forward to?

"I love the opportunity to gather with colleagues in a relaxed and supportive environment to learn, share, and be inspired. Most of the year is so busy, it's hard to find time to reflect on ministry. This gathering gives people time to reflect on personal experience and resonate with the experience of others."
